This project is vital to the community of Summit. Due to demographic changes, largely that older people leave town at a quicker rate because of high taxes, there has been an influx of school aged children in the last thirty years. I graduated Summit High School in '94 with 150 students, while the current 9th grade class carries 300. Was there a double in available housing in that time?

Opponents to the project can point to anomaly years with large classes in the past, but the averages are up significantly as Summit now is on the verge of being classified as a Group IV school by the NJSIAA. In the thirty years that this demographic shift has occurred, there hasn't been a commensurate growth in field space - not even close.

Scheduled sports activities at Summit fields now far outstrip what was once sufficient space. Across all sports - field hockey, soccer, high school flag football, band, outdoor track, football, lacrosse etc - the field demand is overwhelming to satisfy the needs. And most of the aforementioned sports operate at the youth level across genders as well. Our current youth football teams practice at 6:30pm at night because the high school teams control the fields until that time. Due to this, our youth players are in serious harm of injury three nights/week as football is a high contact sport and garners the absolute attention and visibility of both the players and the coaches.

3/4th grade flag football this year had to turn kids away because they only had one time slot and wouldn't have room for all the demand. Telling 3rd graders they can't participate because there is no room is appalling, particularly for a community offered program.

I fully support lights at lower tatlock field and would like to see a compromise made regarding a "turn off time" Lights!!

I think the community needs football games on Friday nights. There were 8 regular season games. Therefore I can't believe this project is being pushed through. Once again, the neighbors' voices in the tatlock area were not heard. Neighbors are overwhelmingly opposed to this. There is one light the fields sign on Butler Parkway as opposed to countless stop the stadium signs. It seems like it's full steam ahead with no regard to the feel of the

The traffic study conducted seems inadequate considering it does not take into consideration the impact to canoe brook parkway, which sees an increase in traffic and cars parked on the road during any events at the field. Further, with the proposed canoe Brook parkway sidewalk project, which includes narrowing canoe Brook parkway by 9 feet at certain areas, it would be irresponsible to not consider the projects in tandem and potential impacts of both on each other.

Tatlock field has been there since 1960. There have been football games and track events there ever since. It is the only stadium seating in Summit. With the increase in both women's and men's sports, field space is at a premium. It isn't worth it to light the grass fields at Memorial Field because grass fields cannot be played on when weather is back and in when you do it damages the field surface and inequality would cause injuries.

Although I emphasize with the Tatlock area residents, the fact is, Tatlock belongs to all Summit residents. Those who live in the surrounding area likely moved there because of the playground, proximity to Washington and the access to open space for their children to practice sports. The also assumed the risk of crowds when moving to the neighborhood. It's like buying a home on Morris Avenue and complaining about traffic, or those who live near the other Summit Schools complaining about on street parking on school days and crowded streets during drop off and pick-up. All assume the risk. To complain about the conditions and be hostile to visitors is unacceptable.

These have been asked previously at community meetings, in emails to the DCP and Councilman Smallwood, and at various council meetings. They have not been answered. 1) We are told in the latest DCP email that there is a shortage of field space in Summit and that "current sports league presidents agree" on this "fact." Where is the data to support this premise? I cannot find it on the DCP page or anywhere on the City of Summit's website. Please provide field usage numbers by sport and season, and please show what teams and/or sports have not had adequate field space, and whether that was due to a grass field being unusable because of weather. 2) If your data supports the concept that field space is an issue, can you please explain the plan for lighting Tatlock and how that would specifically address and solve this supposed problem? Again, data would be helpful here. 3) Is the City using any of the findings of the Master Plan to support the proposal for lighting Tatlock? If so, can you please show where these lights are recommended in the current master plan? If the DCP is not using the City's master plan, can you please explain why it is not? Surely, a plan that the City has paid for with thousands of dollars of taxpayer money should be used as the guideline for maintaining and improving our recreational facilities. If it is not, I am writing to express my deep concern about the way the Department of Community Programs has handled the discussions surrounding the proposal to install lights on the football field permanently. It has become increasingly evident that the agency has not made any meaningful efforts to listen to or address the community's concerns.

Most recently, the decision to host a meeting at LCJSMS that intentionally prioritizes voices in support of lighting the field—while neglecting dissenting opinions—demonstrates a clear bias. This approach not only alienates those with legitimate concerns but also undermines the agency's obligation to represent and serve the entire community fairly. The email requesting only comments in support is so aggravating, especially after attending those open community forums where comments questioning the need for lights were recorded with eye-rolling and visible disdain from the DCP leaders, who appear unprofessional and unapologetic about their inability to remain neutral. If the Department of Community Programs truly acts on behalf of all residents, it should avoid even the appearance of favoritism and make every effort to foster an inclusive dialogue.

Additionally, it is troubling that no substantive evidence or formal study has been presented to justify the need for permanent lighting. Relying solely on anecdotal support from proponents is not sufficient to make such a significant, long-term decision that could impact the quality of life for many in our community. Where is the data demonstrating the necessity of this project?

A few years ago, I had the honor of being a football coach for a season. Though I'm not a football aficionado to the same degree that other parents are, I was able to help corral the young athletes and help the coaches in supporting the kids to learn and do their best. Some of those kids are well on their way to becoming high school stars in sports, on stage or academically, or otherwise.

As always, there are a few talented standouts, and this group was no exception. I remember two boys that were new to football and appeared to be great athletes. I am in favor of lighting Tatlock field - benefits are very important to our youth sports programs
I was unable to attend today's meeting to express my strong objection to the lighting of Tatlock field. Our neighborhood has had to deal with additional traffic, illegal parking, garbage, and noise since the turfing of Tatlock, which our family fought hard against from the beginning. Lighting Tatlock will further burden the Tatlock neighbors with all of these problems into the night as well as creating new light pollution. When do the needs of the Tatlock I am out of town and was not able to attend the meeting this evening, so I am writing to express that I am against this proposal. I am against it now, just as I was against the proposal to turf Tatlock back in 2006.

The compromise reached at that time was to install turf, but not light the field. Apparently, though, the City feels that this compromise does not have to be honored, and is going to, once again, create an atmosphere where those in favor are encouraged to express their support for all of the positive things that lights will bring ("community, celebration, and creating moments that last a lifetime"), while, ostensibly, weighing the "concerns of the neighbors."

I can't tell you how ridiculous this all is. Why? Because there is—and always will be—a small, but very vocal group of people who just love sports—football in particular—and think that it was just be great if "we" had lights on the field. And, not surprisingly, there are homeowners—taxpayers, Summit residents just like everyone else—who understand the negative impact having lights will have on them—on their enjoyment of their homes; on their property values; and on the sense of community in their neighborhoods.

Apparently, DCP whole-heartedly agrees with the pro-lighting fanatics, stating in their recent email: "Friday night lights aren't just for football—they're about community, celebration, and creating moments that last a lifetime. With lights on the field it strengthens community connections, and gives our athletes the spotlight they deserve." To characterize this email as a dereliction of duty on the part of the DCP is an understatement. In the end, I believe I have serious concerns about the proposal to install lights on the field, a decision that will have significant and lasting impacts on our neighborhood.

First, I want to acknowledge that my own children play sports in this town. I deeply value the role athletics play in fostering the health and well-being of our community's children. However, as much as I support the town's commitment to sports, I'm equally concerned about the health and well-being of the residents who would be exposed to the detrimental effects of outdoor artificial lighting at night. Research has shown that excessive nighttime light can disrupt sleep, increase stress, and have other negative health effects. Diabetes, obesity, depression, heart disease, cancer are just a few of the diseases linked to increased exposure to artificial light at night in recent studies. So many communities are doing all they can to reduce nighttime artificial light in the wake of these findings, while we are doing the total opposite with this project.

Even with advanced technology like DarkSky-certified lights, artificial lighting will still have negative effects. The environmental impact study may claim "zero-footcandles of light spillage," but this only measures horizontal light. It doesn't account for the ambient brightness that will undoubtedly affect nearby homes. Shielding and aiming can only do so much; the perception of light and its impact on daily life cannot be fully captured in technical measurements. It should also be mentioned that 70-80 foot light poles are much taller than any nearby structure, and we will have to live with that unsightliness forever. The tallest nearby trees are 30 feet. 70-80 foot structures have no place in a residential neighborhood like ours.

Moreover, without clear evidence that this is the only viable solution to limited field space, it's hard to accept that such a significant change is necessary. Are there alternative locations that can be turfed, or other approaches that could meet the town's needs without disrupting our neighborhood? These questions remain unanswered.

Additionally, the lights would bring extended hours of activity. Evening games and practices will increase noise, traffic, and congestion during times when our neighborhood is currently quiet. For families like mine, this means I am in support of the tatlock light project. After attending the presentations last night at the Middle School I came away with the opinion the pros far out way the cons. Field space is at a crisis level and for SHS to maintain the upper echelon HS sports program s lights are critical to long term success. Kids need outlets away from screens I think the lights will be a great addition to the field and will allow the town to use it for more activities.

I am happy the town is considering this lighting project at Tatlock field. As a nearby resident, I am not against it per se. However, I urge the Council to consider the parking situation for this project, which is something that seems has been largely overlooked. There is an issue with parking on Sheridan Rd. and Lewis Ave. during games and graduation for example when cars are parked on both sides of the Sheridan Rd street. The streets become effectively one way streets. The substantial costs associated with this project do not appear justified, and the benefits presented were unconvincing. The lighting is likely to disrupt residents' quality of life and could negatively impact local wildlife (primarily bats). A few questions for the lighting professionals: 1) If stadium lights are not approved, or in the interim, do they provide non-diesel temporary lighting that could be used for Friday night lights? 2) From experience with similar projects, how often are repairs/maintenance required after lights are installed & for what time period are repairs/maintenance covered for free of charge? If a charge, what costs could be expected to incur for that?

Questions for DCP - 1) Will the same lighting company be handling the required new lighting on pathways & the I do not live in the Tatlock neighborhood and will not be directly impacted by the proposed stadium lights, but I am a Summit resident who is concerned about the use of tax dollars, the well-being of all Summit residents, and the environment. I strongly oppose the proposed stadium lights.

I am dismayed that the environmental impact statement did not even mention the impact of stadium lights on insects, probably because if it was addressed the authors would have had to acknowledge the devastating impact not just to insects and pollinators, but to all beings down the food chain. I couldn't help thinking after reading the environmental and traffic reports that the City succeeded in paying "experts" to say exactly what the City wanted said. The reports are clearly one-sided and biased and were written to support a predetermined conclusion. I am upset that my tax dollars were used to support this farce.

Below is an excerpt from a report from the Center for Biological Diversity in a report prepared to assess the impact of stadium lights along Arizona's southern border:

"Artificial lighting at night threatens insect biodiversity. Lighting can change nocturnal insect behaviors such as feeding, migration and dispersal, predator avoidance, and reproduction. Studies show a high likelihood that the effects of night lighting on insects can cause cascading effects on the larger food chain and ecosystem function. Artificial lighting may even diminish pollination success by disrupting predator-prey relationships and natural rhythms."

No amount of shielding or other technology will mitigate the harmful impact of stadium lighting on insects. The I would like to understand more about what policies are planned to mitigate the issues people are concerned about; and to what extent the council can guaranteed these policies will not only be put into place (and not reversed), but also enforced: (e.g. parking enforcement, noise ordinances, shut-off times, shut-off when not-in use

I write in strong support of the proposal to install lights at Tatlock Field. This improvement will bring significant benefits to Summit's residents, including enhanced recreational opportunities for students, families, and community members. By extending the field's usable hours, we can better accommodate various sports teams and youth programs—providing them with safe, well-lit spaces to practice and play, while easing scheduling

through the project process, the city will develop policies and procedures to govern and limit the use of the lights.
